Call to Order. Call to order by C. Francisco at 1:32 pm

Committee Updates

I. GEAC - C. Francisco

- Discussed the five-year review process of course syllabi looking to be given General Education attributes; mentioned the goal of moving past the review process into a deeper discussion of General Education at OSU; provided an update on the role of the General Education Task Force in the larger conversation of General Education at OSU and the use of a General Education Task Force Survey (GETFS) to gauge institutional opinion of current processes and procedures
- R. Chung gave an update on the GETFS survey that opened on March 28, 2022; mentioned that the survey would be open as long as needed by direction of the Task Force
- II. CAGE M. Bayles
 - Presented 2021-2022 as the pilot year for the new General Education cycle of Professionalism and Ethics;
 Professionalism will be assessed via a Qualtrics survey for instructors and internship supervisors; Ethics will be assessed through the usual artifact collection process
 - Monday, April 4th, would be the deadline for initial recruitment emails to be sent out to each college via their CAGE representative
 - Presented the upcoming General Education Assessment Cycle (see below); R. Chung emphasized the need for
 Diversity to be assessed before Accreditation in 2024-2025 as well as the importance of protecting against survey
 fatigue by having Diversity correspond with the Campus Climate Survey timeline

- III. AAIC R. Chung (on behalf of J. Van Delinder)
 - Mentioned the following projects that have been completed over the academic year or are in the process of being completed currently:
 - o Transition to Nuventive Improvement Platform
 - o 2021 State Regents Report
 - Assessment Feedback Survey (AFS) creation and pilot (ongoing)
 - 5-year Review Rubric creation and pilot (ongoing)
 - Student Engagement Survey (SES) ongoing with current response rate of 29%; SES will be combined with Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) and shortened for next year's administration
 - Quality Initiative document has been discussed amongst AAIC and will next be reviewed by IC in April

AAIC Discussion

- I. OSU Outcomes Assessment Feedback Survey data collection
 - R. Chung mentioned that this survey is currently ongoing and will close in later May; current response rate of approximately 16%
- II. HLC Quality Initiative draft endorsement
 - C. Francisco asked for and received a full voting endorsement on the QI document; motion to endorse by K. Hickman; seconded by J. Comer
- III. 2022-23 Assessment funding request (updated guidelines and timeframe)

- K. Holcomb announced the update of funding request deadlines on UAT website as well as an update to all program coordinators regarding funding to go out Monday, April 4th
- K. Holcomb announced the creation and release of new Nuventive Improvement Platform videos on the Canvas Community Page as well as Nuventive itself; this will be announced to program coordinators in an email blast in late April
- IV. 2022 UAT award process using the Five-Year Review ('16-'17, '17-'18, '18-'19, '19-'20, '20-'21)
 - R. Chung presented UAT's intention to use the five-year review process when picking winners for the 2022 UAT Excellence award; emphasized the extra time leeway that would be provided to programs and UAT reviewers by taking this action
- V. Upcoming POA report submission timeline in fall
 - R. Fitzgerald announced the 2022 POA deadline of September 10th, with the intention of providing programs with an extra few weeks if needed upon communication with UAT; Nuventive system will be locked the first week of October for UAT's annual review period
- VI. AAIC Chairperson election will vote on the May email update
