



Assessment & Academic Improvement Council (AAIC) Minutes

October, 2022 • Email Meeting

Updates:

- 2021-22 Student Learning Outcomes annual assessment report submission progress:
 - 84.2% of programs have submitted their annual reports [excluding certificates] and 15.8% of program reports are missing.
- Meetings have been scheduled with college representatives to discuss five-year assessment report review and action plans for upcoming semesters.
 - The UAT Award of Excellence finalists have been identified as a result of the five-year review. The finalists and their programs will be discussed with each college assessment representative where a winner will be selected.
- Nuventive Improvement Platform was locked to “Read Only” access on Monday, October 3rd so that an uninterrupted review of the reports may be conducted. Full access will resume later this fall (likely in November).
- UAT will present to Faculty Council on 12/13 on behalf of AAIC. This presentation will provide an overview of Assessment at OSU, the role of AAIC and UAT, information about Nuventive, and more.

Discussion:

- J. Comer approved the September Meeting minutes and A. Doust seconded. The minutes were approved.
- A. Doust and M. Bayles commented their support of the OSU Student Satisfaction and Engagement Survey (SSES) draft. J. Comer asked if the color schemes associated with each question of the survey were associated with any particular meaning. S. Heragu asked if the number of questions can be reduced to further increase response rates. These questions will be followed up on in the November meeting.
- J. Comer, A. Doust, M. Bayles, S. Heragu, and T. Lightner commented their support of the Missing POA Report Guidelines document. Final discussion and endorsement will be conducted in the November AAIC meeting. The document will be shared with the State Regents via the annual report due on 12/2.
