 - O In 2019, CAGE voted to implement a new four year cycle for General Education Assessment. Student Engagement was taken out of the Gen Ed cycle and instead was decided to be assessed as an institutional survey, along with Student Satisfaction. Information Literacy and Professionalism and Ethics were added to the cycle and had not previously been assessed by OSU. We are wrapping up the reporting process for the 2021 assessment of Diversity and are now currently planning the assessment procedures for 2022 assessment of Professionalism and Ethics.
- General Education implemented in Nuventive Improvement Platform
 - The reporting structure for General Education Cycles will be implemented into the Nuventive Improvement Platform. This means that results from each year's GE Assessment Cycle could be housed in one central location/database. We would easily be able to make longitudinal comparisons and easily access reporting information.
